

GRADUATION SUNDAY

On Sunday, May 18, we'll be celebrating Graduation Sunday across all of our campuses! FAITHFUL STEWARDSHIP + BOLD GENEROSITY

At our recent Charge Conference, two significant decisions were made regarding the use and future of our church properties:

- The sale of the former parsonage near the Third Avenue Campus was formally approved. With the hiring of our Director of Congregational Care, who does not require housing as part of her role, the Leadership Team discerned that the parsonage no longer aligns with our current ministry needs.
- The transfer of ownership of the church-owned portion of the parking lot behind the First Church Campus to the City of Big Rapids was also approved. The City will repave, restripe, and maintain the entire lot, while ensuring continued use for church events and worship. This partnership relieves us of future maintenance costs and strengthens our connection to the downtown community.

But perhaps even more important than what we're releasing is what we're choosing to do with what we've been given! The Leadership Team has made the bold and faithful decision to give 10% of the net proceeds from the sale of the Third Avenue parsonage to Our Brother's Keeper, a vital local ministry currently engaged in a capital campaign to expand their services to those in crisis.

This gift represents not just a tithe, but a commitment to the values we proclaim: compassion, justice, and community-rooted generosity. A minimum of \$12,000 will be contributed—a tangible sign that we are not simply consolidating resources but releasing them for God's work beyond our walls.

In every decision—property, personnel, or programming—our focus remains the same: to align our resources with our mission to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. THINK ABOUT IT THIS WEEK

You've likely heard the phrase, "God won't give you more than you can handle." While often said with care, it's not actually in the Bible, and it can lead people to feel ashamed or alone when life becomes overwhelming. In 2 Corinthians, Paul tells us plainly: things got so hard he "despaired of life itself." But even in that despair, he discovered a deeper truth - that God doesn't expect us to be strong all the time. God offers strength in our weakness, hope in our despair, and help through community and grace.

Reflection Questions:

- Have you ever felt pressure to be strong when you were actually struggling?
- What helps you remember that it's okay not to have it all together?
- How can you be present for someone else this week—without offering quick fixes or clichés?

Prayer: *God of comfort and compassion, Thank You for not expecting us to carry everything on our own. When life feels heavy, remind us that You are near. Help us lean on You, trust your strength, and be gentle with ourselves and others. Amen.*

Final Thought: The promise isn't that we'll always be strong. The promise is that God will always be with us—even when we're not.

COMING NEXT WEEK

We've all heard it—but is it true? Next Sunday, we'll take a closer look at the popular phrase "God helps those who help themselves" and hold it up to the light of Scripture. Psalm 121 paints a different picture: one of a God who watches over us, helps us, and never sleeps on the job. Join us as we explore what it really means to trust in God's grace and provision—especially when we can't do it all on our own.
