

TABLE TALK – WEDNESDAYS AT NOON

Beginning Wednesday, February 4, join Pastor Jeremy for Table Talk at the First Church campus. Bring your lunch and gather around the table for open, relaxed conversation and connection. This is a space to talk about whatever is on your mind — current events, questions of faith, or life in general. There’s no formal agenda, just time to listen, share, and be in community together.

Throughout the New Testament, table fellowship is a powerful theme — meeting people where they are, building relationships, and creating space for honest conversation over food. Table Talk is one of the ways we’re honoring that tradition today, while also living into our values of connection, hospitality, and meaningful dialogue.

(From Pastor Jeremy: This isn’t a gripe session, church business meeting, or a place to troubleshoot programs and policies. The goal is connection, dialogue, and shared reflection in a relaxed and welcoming space.)

LENTEN BOOK STUDY: KNOWING WHO WE ARE

Across the Michigan Conference, United Methodists are spending time this year reflecting on who we are, where we’ve come from, and what it truly means to be part of The United Methodist Church. To join in that wider conversation, we’ll be offering an in-person book study at the First Church campus on Wednesdays at 11AM, beginning February 25 and continuing through April 1.

We’ll be using the same book that the Michigan Conference is encouraging churches across the state to read: *Knowing Who We Are* by Lacey C. Warner.

This study is a great opportunity to learn what it really means to be United Methodist — our Wesleyan roots, our core values, and the way faith is meant to shape our lives, our communities, and the world.

It’s also a very practical option for anyone considering becoming a member of UMMMC. We don’t typically offer formal membership classes, and participation in a class is not required in order to become a member. That said, if membership is something you’re considering, this study is a great way to explore what it means to be United Methodist in a meaningful and accessible way.

If you are interested in becoming a member, please reach out directly to Pastor Jeremy to let him know. Our current plan is to welcome new members on Easter Sunday, alongside our confirmands.

We’ll be ordering books and will have them available in the church office for \$15.
