

NATIVE AMERICAN MINISTRY SUNDAY OFFERING

Each year, United Methodists across the connection join together to support Native American Ministries Sunday - an opportunity to recognize the gifts, history, and sacred identities of Native peoples and to address the ongoing need for understanding and partnership.

Your contributions help strengthen Native American ministries within our conferences and provide scholarships for Native individuals pursuing licensed or ordained ministry. Half of every gift remains in our annual conference to support Native-led programs through the Committee on Native American Ministries (CONAM), which helps develop ministries, promote cultural education, and advocate for Indigenous communities. The remaining funds are divided equally: one-quarter supports seminary scholarships for Native students, and one-quarter is used to develop leadership, economic, and cultural renewal programs in Native communities across the country.

Last year, nearly \$240,000 was raised. Every dollar makes a difference. Together, we honor the past, invest in the present, and build a future where Native voices and ministries continue to thrive.

THINK ABOUT IT THIS WEEK

"God helps those who help themselves" sounds wise, but it's not found anywhere in Scripture. In fact, the Bible often tells a different story of a God who helps the broken, the weary, the overwhelmed, and those who don't know where to turn. Psalm 121 reminds us that our help comes not from our own effort, but from the Lord, who watches over us constantly and never sleeps.

Reflection Questions:

- Where in your life are you trying to "handle it" on your own?
- How does it change your perspective to remember that God offers help simply because you need it?
- Who around you might need help this week, and how can you offer it without judgment or condition?

Prayer for the Week:

God of steady love, thank you for being my help even when I don't have it all together. Teach me to ask for help with humility and to offer it with compassion. Let me trust in your care more than my own strength. Amen.

Final Thought:

You don't have to prove yourself to receive God's help. Grace meets you where you are, simply because you need it.

COMING NEXT WEEK

Next Sunday, we take on one of the most enduring and fear-filled ideas in Christian tradition: hell. Is it really a place of fire, torment, and eternal punishment? And does God use fear to get our attention?

We'll explore and look at the origins of our modern ideas around hell and talk about Jesus' parable of the rich man and Lazarus - not as a literal map of the afterlife, but as a powerful challenge to how we live, love, and notice the suffering around us. What if Jesus didn't tell this story to scare us about what happens when we die, but to wake us up to how we live now?

Join us as we move past fear-based faith and into a deeper conversation about justice, compassion, and the hope-filled heart of God.
