UMMMC DINNER SCRAMBLE – A SIMPLE WAY TO CONNECT

One of the best parts of being a church community is getting to know one another beyond Sunday morning. This April, we're inviting you to do just that through the UMMMC Dinner Scramble—a fun and easy way to connect with others across our church family. Anyone can sign up to share a meal with others from UMMMC. You can register as an individual, a couple, or a family. After the sign-up period closes, participants will be randomly grouped, giving everyone a chance to meet and spend time with people they may not already know.

The dinners will take place during the last two weeks of April, and each group will decide the details that work best for them. Some groups may choose to meet at a restaurant, others might gather at someone's home, grab fast food together, or even enjoy a picnic if the weather cooperates. The goal is simple: good food, relaxed conversation, and meaningful connection.

Beginning Sunday, March 8, you can sign up:

- **In person** - Sign-up sheets are available in the Fellowship Hall at First Church or at the back of the sanctuary at our Paris Campus.
- **By email** - Send your name, phone number, number attending, and whether you are signing up as an individual, couple, or family to register@ummcosta.org.

Sign-ups will close on March 31, and groups will be paired shortly afterward, so everyone has time to plan their dinner.

MARCH MISSION GIVING FOCUS: UMCOR

This month we turn our hearts and hands toward one of The United Methodist Church's most trusted and impactful mission partners: the United Methodist Committee on Relief, known widely as UMCOR. At its core, UMCOR answers Jesus' call to love our neighbors and bear one another's burdens by bringing help and hope where suffering is greatest.

The United Methodist Committee on Relief is the global humanitarian relief and development organization of The United Methodist Church. UMCOR serves as the Church's principal response to human suffering around the world—whether caused by natural disasters, war and conflict, famine, or other overwhelming crises. It is a nonprofit ministry operating under the General Board of Global Ministries and engages in relief efforts in more than 70 countries, including here in the United States.

One defining strength of UMCOR is that 100% of every dollar designated for a specific disaster or relief project goes directly to that work—not to administrative costs. That's because the "costs of doing business" for UMCOR are funded through a separate annual offering that underwrites administrative expenses so gifts to specific projects can go entirely to those in need.

If you would like to support the work of the United Methodist Committee on Relief, you can give through our regular offering process. Simply note "UMCOR" on your check or on your giving envelope. You may also contribute online and designate UMCOR, so your gift is directed to this important ministry.

THINK ABOUT IT: TENACIOUS MISSION

In Luke's Gospel, a lawyer asks Jesus a question that sounds simple but carries enormous weight: "Who is my neighbor?"

Jesus responds not with a definition, but with a story—the parable of the Good Samaritan. A wounded man lies on the road, and two religious leaders pass by without stopping. Then a Samaritan, someone who would have been viewed as an outsider or even an enemy, sees the man, has compassion, and refuses to walk away. The Samaritan does more than offer a quick act of kindness. He binds wounds, carries the injured man to safety, pays for his care, and promises to return. His love refuses to stay small.

For Jesus, love of neighbor is not an abstract idea. It is practical, courageous, and sometimes inconvenient. It crosses boundaries, interrupts routines, and calls us to see the humanity in those we might otherwise overlook.

This is part of the Methodist story as well. From its earliest days, the Wesleyan movement understood that faith is not only about personal devotion—it is also about responding to the needs of the world. John Wesley and the early Methodists visited prisoners, cared for the poor, advocated for justice, and built systems of care in their communities. They practiced what we might call holy tenacity: a refusal to ignore human suffering.

As we reflect on this story, we are invited to ask ourselves some honest questions.

- When you hear the story of the Good Samaritan, which character do you most identify with, and why?
- Who are the "neighbors" you encounter in your daily life who may be easy to overlook?
- What barriers—time, fear, assumptions, busyness—sometimes prevent us from responding with compassion?
- Where might God be inviting you to practice a more tenacious love this week?

Action Steps

This week, consider one small but intentional way to embody the love described in this story:

- Pay closer attention to the people around you—in your neighborhood, workplace, or community.
- Look for an opportunity to offer practical care to someone who may be struggling.
- Reach out to someone who may feel overlooked or alone.
- Support a ministry or organization working to meet needs in our community.

Prayer for the Week

Gracious God, open our eyes to the needs around us and soften our hearts with compassion. Give us courage to love our neighbors in practical ways and help us follow the example of Christ by responding with mercy and care. Shape our lives so that your grace may be seen in the way we treat one another. Amen.

A Closing Thought

The question in Luke's Gospel begins with "Who is my neighbor?" but Jesus quietly shifts the focus. The deeper question becomes: What does it mean to be a neighbor? This week, may we live as people whose love refuses to stay small.
