

AUGUST MISSION GIVING: JONAH FOUNDATION

Our mission giving focus for August is the Jonah Foundation, a local organization serving men who have experienced incarceration, addiction, and other barriers to rebuilding their lives.

Returning to the community after incarceration can be extraordinarily difficult. Finding stable housing and meaningful employment, navigating probation requirements, rebuilding relationships, and maintaining sobriety can become overwhelming—especially when someone is expected to face those challenges alone. The Jonah Foundation works to ensure that men making this transition have both practical assistance and a supportive community surrounding them. Through its residential reentry and recovery home, the Jonah Foundation provides a supervised sober-living environment along with employment connections, probation navigation, mentoring, counseling, fellowship, and social, mental, and spiritual support. Its peer-led approach helps participants develop the stability, accountability, relationships, and skills needed to become thriving members of the community.

This work reflects an important truth of our faith: *no human being should be defined only by their worst decision, their deepest struggle, or the most difficult chapter of their story.* God's grace continually creates possibilities for healing, restoration, and new life. When people receive the support they need to break cycles of addiction and incarceration, the impact extends beyond a single individual. Families are strengthened, relationships can begin to heal, and the entire community becomes healthier.

Throughout August, we invite you to support the Jonah Foundation through our monthly mission giving. Your gifts will help provide the safe environment, guidance, practical resources, and caring relationships that make a successful return to the community possible. Together, we can help ensure that those seeking a new beginning do not have to make that journey alone.

MICAH: FAITHFUL LIVING IN A FRACTURED WORLD

Beginning August 30, both our First and Paris campuses will begin a new six-week preaching series, Micah: Faithful Living in a Fractured World. Micah spoke to communities facing injustice, economic inequality, failed leadership, violence, fear, and uncertainty about the future. Although his words were first proclaimed centuries ago, the questions he raises remain strikingly relevant: *What does faithfulness look like when the world around us feels fractured? How should people of faith use power, wealth, and influence? What does God expect from our leaders—and from each of us? Is peace possible? Can mercy have the final word?*

Micah does not offer easy answers or empty reassurance. He honestly names the ways people and institutions can depart from God's purposes. Yet his message does not end with condemnation. Micah points toward God's vision of a world shaped by justice, peace, restoration, belonging, and steadfast mercy.

Throughout the series, we will discover that faith is about more than what happens during worship. God's grace shapes how we listen, share resources, exercise leadership, make peace, treat our neighbors, respond to harm, and participate in the life of our wider community. Each week will explore another dimension of faithful living:

- August 30 — A Prophet from the Countryside
- September 6 — When Wealth Becomes Worship
- September 13 — The Responsibility of Leadership
- September 20 — God's Vision for the World
- September 27 — What Does God Really Want?
- October 4 — The God Who Delights in Mercy

From Micah's reminder that God often speaks through overlooked voices to his beautiful declaration that God delights in mercy, this series will invite us to listen carefully, examine our shared life, and imagine how we can participate in God's healing work.

Join us at either campus as we explore what it means to do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with God in a fractured world.

GO DEEPER AT TABLE TALK

Our exploration of Micah will not end when Sunday worship is over! Each Wednesday, beginning September 2 through the end of the series, at 12:00PM, Table Talk will offer an opportunity to dig more deeply into the week's Scripture and continue the conversation begun during worship.

Together, we will ask questions, share perspectives, and consider how Micah's message speaks to our lives, our church, and the world around us. No special knowledge or preparation is required—just bring your lunch, your curiosity, and a willingness to join the conversation.

Whether you attend every week or simply stop by when you can, Table Talk is also a great opportunity to connect with others and make new friends. Join us Wednesdays at noon as we learn, listen, and grow together.
