

### THINK ABOUT IT - WEEK TWO: PROPHETIC PEACE

Peace is a beautiful word, but in Scripture it's rarely a comfortable one. Biblical peace isn't about keeping things calm or avoiding conflict. It's not a spiritual "quiet down" so everyone can feel better. The peace John the Baptist announces is rooted in transformation—clearing space for God to do something new, healing what has been broken, and aligning our lives with the deeper rhythms of God's justice.

In this week's texts, John cries out from the wilderness, calling people to prepare the way for the One who brings true peace. Malachi echoes that call with the image of a refiner's fire and a fuller's soap—images that sound harsh at first, until we remember that refining and cleansing are always for the sake of restoration. The fire removes what distorts. The cleansing restores what is beautiful. Both make room for peace to take root.

This kind of peace is active. It asks something of us. It invites us to participate rather than spectate—to become people who help straighten the crooked paths and clear away the debris in our own hearts and communities. As we continue through Advent, we're reminded that peace isn't the absence of struggle but the presence of God's transforming love right in the middle of it.

#### **Reflection Questions**

- What is one place in your life where you're craving peace—but avoiding the work that might allow that peace to grow?
- John prepares the way by telling the truth with courage. Where might God be inviting you to speak truthfully (with compassion) this week?
- Are there habits, assumptions, or patterns in your life that might need refining in order to make room for deeper peace?
- How can our church embody prophetic peace—peace that heals, restores, and stands with the vulnerable?

### Prayer for the Week

Merciful God, prepare my heart for your peace. Where I have avoided hard truths, give me courage. Where I have held onto what harms, refine me in your love. Where my spirit feels cluttered or crowded, clear away what keeps me from you. Make my life a place where your peace can take root—for my sake, for the sake of others, and for the healing of the world you love. Amen.

### Putting It Into Practice

This week, choose one simple way to "prepare the way" for peace in your daily life. It might be:

- Practicing a moment of honest self-reflection each day
- Reaching out to someone with whom reconciliation feels possible
- Choosing to speak truth with kindness in a difficult situation
- Creating a small space in your home or routine that invites quiet and prayer
- Letting go of one thing—large or small—that you know isn't serving you

Whatever you choose, let it be a step toward the peace God is shaping in you, in us, and in the world God loves.
