## Welcome to Paris!

### THINK ABOUT IT: FAVOR ISN’T FAIR

James does not treat favoritism as a small social misstep. He names it as a contradiction of the gospel itself. When we rank people by wealth, status, appearance, or usefulness, we are no longer seeing one another through the lens of grace. Faith that works refuses to play favorites—not because everyone is the same, but because everyone belongs. The question James places before us is not whether we intend to be fair, but whether our habits, assumptions, and systems reflect the mercy we claim to believe in.

### Questions for Reflection

- Where do I notice myself making quick judgments about people—before I really know them?
- Who feels most at home in the spaces I’m part of? Who might feel overlooked or out of place?
- Are there voices I tend to trust more quickly than others? Why?
- How does mercy—not comfort or familiarity—challenge the way I relate to others?
- What would it look like for my faith to shape how I welcome, listen, and respond?

### A Prayer for the Week

*Gracious God, you show no partiality, yet we confess that we often do. Open our eyes to the ways we sort, rank, and judge—sometimes without even realizing it. Soften our hearts where comfort has made us careless, and teach us to see one another through your mercy. Form us into people whose faith makes room, whose love does not play favorites, and whose lives reflect the grace we have received. Amen.*

### Practice It This Week

Faith that works shows up in ordinary choices. Small acts matter. They shape us more than we realize. You might try one of these:

- Notice who gets your attention. Pay attention to whose voices you instinctively trust—and whose you tend to overlook.
- Practice intentional welcome. Sit with someone new, speak to someone who is often quiet, or reach out beyond your usual circle.
- Interrupt assumptions. When you catch yourself making a snap judgment, pause and ask, “What story might I be missing?”
- Choose mercy. In a moment where it’s easier to dismiss or avoid, lean toward compassion instead.

### Final Thought

James reminds us that faith is not proven by what we say we believe, but by how we treat one another—especially those who are easy to overlook. Favoritism may feel ordinary in the world around us, but it has no place in a community shaped by grace. Faith that works is faith that makes room.

### FEBRUARY MISSION GIVING FOCUS: CAMP SCHOLARSHIPS
