LENTEN SERMON SERIES

Beginning Sunday, February 22, and continuing through Palm Sunday, we will journey together through a new series titled Knowing Who We Are, inspired by our congregation-wide book study on the Wesleyan way of grace.

In a time when churches face uncertainty and cultural shifts, it is easy to forget our core identity. This series will return us to the heart of Methodism — a movement grounded in God's grace, shaped by Scripture, formed in community, and sent into the world with holy tenacity.

Each week we will explore what has always made Methodism distinctive:

- Connection that strengthens our shared mission
- Scripture that shapes our imagination
- A faith that refuses to stay small

This is not a nostalgic look backward. It is a prayerful, honest, and hopeful reflection on who we are — and who God is still calling us to be.

Join us as we rediscover the love of God “shed abroad in our hearts” and ask what it means to live that love faithfully in our time.

We hope you'll be with us each Sunday through Palm Sunday as we seek, accept, grow in, and share God's grace together.

THINK ABOUT IT: FINDING GRACE

Early Methodism did not begin as a protest movement. It began as a renewal movement — a group of people who believed that God's grace was not distant, not fragile, and not reserved for a spiritual elite, but alive and active in ordinary human hearts. When John Wesley was asked, "Who is a Methodist?" he did not point to governance, theology exams, or denominational loyalty. He answered simply: a Methodist is one who has "the love of God shed abroad in the heart." That image matters. Love shed abroad. Diffused. Poured out. Circulating.

Questions to Think About This Week

1. When I think about my relationship with God, what emotions surface first — pressure, gratitude, fatigue, trust, anxiety, hope? What might that reveal?
2. Do I tend to approach faith as something I must maintain and manage, or as a gift I am invited to receive and participate in?
3. If love is the defining mark of a Methodist, what has been marking my speech, tone, and reactions lately — especially when I feel stressed or uncertain?

Action Steps for the Week

Renewal rarely begins with dramatic gestures. It begins with steady attention.

- Practice Noticing Grace: Each day this week, pause and name one place where you see God's love at work — in your own life, in another person, or in the wider community. Write it down if you are able. The more we practice seeing grace, the more attuned we become to its presence.
- Create a Moment of Stillness: Set aside five uninterrupted minutes this week. Sit quietly and pray simply: "God, help me live from your love." Resist the urge to fill the silence. Let yourself be held there.
- Let Love Set the Tone.: Before entering a difficult conversation, sending an email, or responding online, ask: Does this reflect the love that has been poured into my heart? This is not about perfection. It is about alignment.

Prayer for the Week

Gracious and Generous God, you move toward us before we are ready. You steady us before we are certain. You love us before we know how to respond. Pour your love into our hearts again. Quiet the anxious places within us. Free us from striving and from fear. Renew our imagination so that we may see your grace at work. Shape our words so that love becomes our mark. Send us into this week grounded in your steady presence. Through Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

To know who we are is to remember that we are a people formed by grace, not a community defined by argument or anxiety, but one renewed again and again by the love of God poured into human hearts. As this Lenten season begins, may we slow down enough to receive what has already been given. May we notice where grace is moving. And may that grace shape how we speak, serve, and live.

Let love be the mark.
