

PROPERTY UPDATE & UPCOMING CHARGE CONFERENCE

Over the past several months, the Leadership Team of United Methodist Ministries of Mecosta County has been engaged in a thoughtful and prayerful process regarding the future of the East Campus (3rd Avenue) property. This discernment has included internal conversations, consultation with district leadership, and ongoing dialogue with community partners—particularly Love INC of Mecosta County.

Through that process, the Leadership Team has come to believe that the most faithful and strategic use of this property is to transfer it to Love INC. Their ability to mobilize churches, coordinate volunteers, and respond directly to community needs positions them to utilize the building in ways that will have a meaningful and lasting impact on the surrounding neighborhood—impact that we, as UMMMC, are not currently resourced to provide on our own.

This decision reflects both a missional and practical reality. The East Campus building is not a space we have the capacity to maintain or redevelop for active ministry. Rather than allowing it to remain underutilized, this partnership creates the opportunity for the property to become a hub of connection, care, and support within the community.

We are grateful to share that the District Committee on Building & Location has reviewed and approved this proposal. This is an important step in the process and affirms the direction our Leadership Team has taken.

What happens next? The next step is to hold a Charge Conference, which is required in the United Methodist Church for matters related to the sale of church property.

CHARGE CONFERENCE - APRIL 1 @ 6:30 PM
FELLOWSHIP HALL (FIRST CHURCH)

At this Charge Conference, eligible members will be asked to vote on the proposed sale of the East Campus property to Love INC of Mecosta County. While anyone is welcome to attend, voting will be limited to those who are members of the Charge Conference, as outlined by our structure.

We believe this step represents an opportunity to align our resources more fully with our mission—to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world—while also strengthening our partnership with an organization that is deeply committed to serving our local community.

We invite you to be in prayer for this process, for the upcoming Charge Conference, and for the future of this property as it continues to serve the people of Mecosta County in new and meaningful ways.

FOR THE WEEK AHEAD:

Palm Sunday appears to begin with celebration—crowds gather, branches are waved, voices rise with hope: "Hosanna! Blessed is the One who comes in the name of the Lord!" It is a moment filled with expectation—a longing for something new, something better, something that will finally set things right. But as the story unfolds, the tone shifts—Jesus enters the temple, the center of religious life, and instead of affirming what is happening there, He overturns tables and drives out those who are exploiting others. What began as a place of prayer had become something else.

This moment can feel unsettling. It challenges the image we often hold of Jesus as gentle and accommodating. But what we see here is not a rejection of love—it is love refusing to ignore what causes harm. This is what we might call holy tenacity. It is the kind of love that does not give up. The kind of love that does not remain silent. The kind of love that is willing to disrupt what is no longer life-giving in order to make space for grace to move again.

Throughout this series, we have been asking: Who are we? This week, that question becomes more pointed. Are we people who simply maintain what is familiar, or are we people willing to follow Christ into the work of transformation?

QUESTIONS TO REFLECT ON

- Where in your life have you experienced a moment when something needed to change in order for growth to happen?
- Are there places where you have become more focused on comfort or familiarity than on what is life-giving?
- What might it look like to practice love that is both compassionate and courageous this week?

ACTION STEPS

- Pay attention to moments this week where something feels out of alignment with the values of love, justice, or compassion.
- Ask where God might be inviting you to respond—not with anger, but with clarity and courage.
- Take one small step toward making space for grace—whether in a conversation, a relationship, or a situation that needs attention.

PRAYER FOR THE WEEK

Faithful God, thank you for your grace that continues to shape and guide us. Give us the courage to follow where you lead, even when the path is challenging. Help us to live with love that is both compassionate and courageous, so that your grace may move more freely in our lives and in the world. Amen.

Palm Sunday reminds us that following Christ is not only about celebration—it is also about transformation. This week, may we be open to the ways God is at work, inviting us to live with holy tenacity and to make space for grace wherever we are.
