

## PROPERTY UPDATE & UPCOMING CHARGE CONFERENCE

Over the past several months, the Leadership Team of United Methodist Ministries of Mecosta County has been engaged in a thoughtful and prayerful process regarding the future of the East Campus (3rd Avenue) property. This discernment has included internal conversations, consultation with district leadership, and ongoing dialogue with community partners—particularly Love INC of Mecosta County.

Through that process, the Leadership Team has come to believe that the most faithful and strategic use of this property is to transfer it to Love INC. Their ability to mobilize churches, coordinate volunteers, and respond directly to community needs positions them to utilize the building in ways that will have a meaningful and lasting impact on the surrounding neighborhood—impact that we, as UMMMC, are not currently resourced to provide on our own.

This decision reflects both a missional and practical reality. The East Campus building is not a space we have the capacity to maintain or redevelop for active ministry. Rather than allowing it to remain underutilized, this partnership creates the opportunity for the property to become a hub of connection, care, and support within the community.

We are grateful to share that the District Committee on Building & Location has reviewed and approved this proposal. This is an important step in the process and affirms the direction our Leadership Team has taken.

What happens next? The next step is to hold a Charge Conference, which is required in the United Methodist Church for matters related to the sale of church property.

**CHARGE CONFERENCE - APRIL 1 @ 6:30 PM**  
**FELLOWSHIP HALL (FIRST CHURCH)**

At this Charge Conference, eligible members will be asked to vote on the proposed sale of the East Campus property to Love INC of Mecosta County. While anyone is welcome to attend, voting will be limited to those who are members of the Charge Conference, as outlined by our structure.

We believe this step represents an opportunity to align our resources more fully with our mission—to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world—while also strengthening our partnership with an organization that is deeply committed to serving our local community.

We invite you to be in prayer for this process, for the upcoming Charge Conference, and for the future of this property as it continues to serve the people of Mecosta County in new and meaningful ways.

## FOR THE WEEK AHEAD: TEXTS THAT SHAPE US

We are shaped by the stories we return to.

Every day, we are surrounded by voices telling us what matters, who belongs, what success looks like, and how to respond to the world around us. Some of those stories come from the news, social media, or cultural expectations. Others come from our own experiences and assumptions. Whether we realize it or not, those stories are forming us—shaping how we think, how we see others, and how we live.

In Deuteronomy 6:4-9, the people of God are invited into something different. They are told to carry the story of God with them—to speak it, remember it, and weave it into the rhythms of daily life. Scripture is not presented as something to reference occasionally, but as something that shapes identity over time. It becomes part of who they are.

In 2 Timothy 3:14-17, we hear that Scripture forms us for a purpose—not simply to know more, but to live differently. While this passage has sometimes been used to treat Scripture like a rulebook or a tool for proving a point, its deeper invitation is about transformation. Scripture is meant to shape our lives in ways that lead to goodness, compassion, and faithful action.

The question for us this week is not just whether we read Scripture, but how it is shaping us.

## Questions to Reflect On

- What stories or voices have been shaping the way you see the world lately?
- When you engage Scripture, do you approach it as information to understand, or as a story to live within?
- What might it look like to carry the story of God with you throughout your day?

## Action Steps

- Choose a short passage of Scripture this week and return to it each day.
- Read it slowly, paying attention to what it reveals about God's character.
- Ask: How might this shape the way I see others or respond today?
- Consider sharing what you're noticing with a friend or family member.

## Prayer for the Week

*God of story and grace, help us to be shaped by your presence and your truth. As we return to Scripture, form our hearts and guide our lives, so that we may reflect your love in all we do. Amen.*

## Closing

We are always living inside a story. This week, be intentional about the one you return to. As you engage Scripture, trust that God is not only speaking—but shaping you, gently and persistently, into a life of love and grace.
