In a world that feels unsteady, where uncertainty shadows our days and weariness settles into our bones, Advent comes to us like a quiet whisper: Do not be afraid. Lift up your hearts. Dare to hope again.

We come longing for light, for renewal, for the courage to dream of a world made whole.

This is the season when we lean forward—toward promise, toward peace, toward the God who draws near.

We come to be awakened, to stay alert, to watch for signs of hope.

Isaiah saw a day when nations would choose peace over violence, when swords would become plowshares, and people would walk in the light of divine love. Today we choose to walk toward that light.

We long for the peace of Christ—justice-rooted, Spirit-led, a peace that prepares the way for healing and renewal.

We light the candle of Peace...trusting that God's way leads us toward mercy, justice, and transformation.

As these candles burn, may hope steady our hearts and peace guide our steps. May we prepare the way for Christ in our homes, our community, and our world.



## THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE

## Isaiah 2:1-5 (New International Version)

 $_1$  This is what Isaiah son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem:  $_2$  In the last days the mountain of the Lord's temple will be established as the highest of the mountains; it will be exalted above the hills, and all nations will stream to it.

<sup>3</sup> Many peoples will come and say, "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the temple of the God of Jacob. He will teach us his ways, so that we may walk in his paths."

The law will go out from Zion, the word of the Lord from Jerusalem. <sup>4</sup>He will judge between the nations and will settle disputes for many peoples. They will beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks. Nation will not take up sword against nation, nor will they train for war anymore.

<sup>5</sup> Come, descendants of Jacob, let us walk in the light of the Lord.

## Mark 13:24-37 (New International Version)

<sup>24</sup> "But in those days, following that distress, "the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light; <sup>25</sup> the stars will fall from the sky, and the heavenly bodies will be shaken."

<sup>26</sup> "At that time people will see the Son of Man coming in clouds with great power and glory. <sup>27</sup> And he will send his angels and gather his elect from the four winds, from the ends of the earth to the ends of the heavens.

<sup>28</sup> "Now learn this lesson from the fig tree: As soon as its twigs get tender and its leaves come out, you know that summer is near. <sup>29</sup> Even so, when you see these things happening, you know that it is near, right at the door. <sup>30</sup> Truly I tell you, this generation will certainly not pass away until all these things have happened. <sup>31</sup> Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will never pass away.

<sup>32</sup> "But about that day or hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. <sup>33</sup> Be on guard! Be alert! You do not know when that time will come. <sup>34</sup> It's like a man going away: He leaves his house and puts his servants in charge, each with their assigned task, and tells the one at the door to keep watch.

<sup>35</sup> "Therefore keep watch because you do not know when the owner of the house will come back—whether in the evening, or at midnight, or when the rooster crows, or at dawn. <sup>36</sup> If he comes suddenly, do not let him find you sleeping. <sup>37</sup> What I say to you, I say to everyone: 'Watch!'"
