THINK ABOUT IT THIS WEEK

Forgiveness isn't easy. It isn't neat. And it certainly isn't always quick. But it is one of the most radical, joy-restoring acts we are invited to practice. Jesus taught that forgiveness is not just something we receive—it's something we extend. Not because the other person always deserves it. Not because the harm didn't matter. But because carrying the weight of it alone slowly steals our joy.

Sometimes, forgiveness means letting go of resentment. Sometimes it means setting a boundary. And sometimes it means releasing someone from your heart—not to excuse what they did, but to reclaim your own

• What hurt or resentment are you still holding on to—and how is it affecting your joy?

• Have you mistaken forgiveness for reconciliation? How might those be different in your life?

• Where might God be nudging you toward healing—not to forget,
