

FROM PASTOR JEREMY: RESURRECTION IS STILL HAPPENING

Easter is here—and with it comes a story we've heard before. A stone rolled away. An empty tomb. Fear turning into something like hope. But here's the question I keep coming back to: What if resurrection isn't just something that happened... but something that is still happening?

On Easter, we don't just remember a moment in history. We step into a reality that continues to unfold. Resurrection shows up wherever life pushes back against death, wherever hope refuses to give up, wherever love refuses to let the last word belong to fear.

It shows up in quiet ways—in healing we didn't expect, in relationships slowly being restored, in the courage to begin again. And sometimes it shows up in bold, disruptive ways—turning over what we thought was settled and calling us into something new.

The good news of Easter isn't just that Jesus was raised. It's that resurrection is the shape of the world God is still creating.

So wherever you find yourself this season—whether you come with deep faith, lingering questions, or something in between—there is room for you in this story.

Because resurrection isn't finished yet, and neither are we.

NEW BIBLE STUDY: JONAH FOR NORMAL PEOPLE

Jonah is one of the most familiar—and most misunderstood—stories in the Bible. This study invites us to look beyond the fish and wrestle with the deeper questions at the heart of the text: justice and mercy, who belongs, and what it means when God doesn't act the way we expect.

Together, we'll explore the historical context, themes, and theology of Jonah, discovering how this ancient story still speaks into our lives today.

CHARGE CONFERENCE APPROVAL AND NEXT STEPS

At the Charge Conference held this week, the motion to transfer the Third Avenue building and associated properties to Love INC of Mecosta County was officially approved. This marks a significant step forward in a process that has been shaped by thoughtful discernment, careful conversation, and a shared desire to use our resources in ways that most effectively serve our community. With Charge Conference approval now complete, we are moving from discernment into implementation. This means:

- Finalizing the purchase agreement and legal documents
- Working with district and conference leadership to complete required approvals
- Coordinating details related to the transition of the property

Once the transfer is finalized, Love INC will assume ownership of the property and responsibility for its use. Our hope—and expectation—is that the building will become an active hub for community-centered ministry under their leadership.

We know that decisions like this can bring a mix of reactions. There is history in that building, and it has mattered to many people. At the same time, we believe this is a step forward—one that allows us to be more focused in our ministry while also ensuring that the Third Avenue property continues to serve the community in meaningful and impactful ways. We are grateful for the work that has gone into this process and for the partnerships that are making this next chapter possible.

THINK ABOUT IT THIS WEEK

Easter is not just something we celebrate—it's something we step into. The story doesn't end at the empty tomb. It begins there. What looked finished wasn't. What felt final wasn't. What seemed buried was not gone—it was waiting. Love rises.

And when love rises, it doesn't stay contained in a moment, a building, or a single day. It moves outward. It disrupts what we thought was settled. It calls us by name, just as it did in the garden. It meets us in places we had already given up on and says, "There is still more here."

Love rises in quiet ways and in undeniable ones—in healing, in courage, in forgiveness, in the decision to begin again. It rises wherever life pushes back against despair, wherever hope refuses to disappear, wherever grace shows up when we least expect it.

This week, the question isn't whether love has risen. The question is: where is it rising now—and will we recognize it when it does?

Questions to Reflect On:

- Where have you assumed the story was over—only to realize something new might still be possible?
- Where do you see signs of life, hope, or renewal breaking through in your life right now?
- What part of your life feels closed off, buried, or stuck—and what might it look like for love to meet you there?
- Who in your life needs to experience the kind of love that refuses to give up or stay buried?

Ways to Live It Out This Week:

- Pay attention: Notice moments where something small feels like new life—don't dismiss it.
- Choose love: In one situation where it would be easier to withdraw, lean in instead.
- Speak life: Offer encouragement, forgiveness, or presence to someone who needs it.
- Show up: Do one tangible act that reflects love rising—especially where it's least expected.

A Prayer for the Week:

God of resurrection, when we cannot see beyond what feels finished, help us trust that love is still at work. Where we feel stuck, bring movement. Where we feel weary, bring new life. Where we feel uncertain, call us by name. And as love rises, give us the courage to follow where it leads. Amen.

Closing Thought:

Love has risen. And it is still rising—in you, through you, and all around you.
