BREAKING THE WHEEL - A LENTEN SERMON SERIES

Some patterns feel bigger than us. Cycles of anger. Cycles of division. Cycles of scarcity. Cycles of injustice. They repeat in our families, our communities, our politics, even in our faith. Lent invites us to slow down long enough to see the wheel turning — and to ask whether it has to keep turning at all.

In this six-week series, we will follow Jesus from the wilderness to Jerusalem and discover how he interrupts cycles of violence, retaliation, religious corruption, fear, and self-preservation. Again and again, Jesus refuses to play by the rules of domination and control. He chooses a different way — and invites us to do the same.

Join us this Lent as we explore what it means to follow the One who does not keep the wheel spinning — but stops it.

THINK ABOUT IT: TAMING THE FIRE

James doesn’t minimize the power of words—he says they are fire. A small
spark can set an entire forest ablaze. A small sentence can reshape a
relationship. A careless phrase can echo for years. If faith that works shapes
how we live, then it must also shape how we speak. This week we’re invited to
ask honest questions: *What kind of fire are my words carrying? Do they warm or
wound? Do they build trust or erode it? Do they reflect the mercy of Christ—or the
anxiety of the culture around me?* James reminds us that blessing and cursing
should not flow from the same mouth, yet we know how easily frustration,
sarcasm, fear, or anger can spill out in ways that diminish others. This isn’t
about being artificially polite. It’s about being intentionally faithful—because
words create worlds.

Questions for Reflection

- How do I speak about people who are not in the room?
- What words do I use for those with whom I disagree?
- Where has my speech been shaped more by fear than by faith?
- Who in my life needs a word of encouragement, repair, or truth?

A Prayer for the Week

*God of light and refining fire, guard my mouth and steady my heart. Let my words
reflect your mercy. When I am tempted to wound, teach me restraint. When silence
would protect injustice, give me courage. Shape my speech so that it builds what
love requires. Amen.*

Practice This Week

- Pause before responding in frustration.
- Refuse to repeat gossip—even subtly.
- Offer one intentional word of encouragement each day.
- Speak up gently when language becomes dehumanizing.
- Before posting or sharing online, ask: Does this reflect mercy?

Final Thought

Transfiguration reminds us that glory shines from Jesus. James reminds us that
fire comes from our mouths. May the fire we carry be refining rather than
destructive, and may our speech reflect the One we claim to follow. Because
faith that works doesn’t just believe differently—it speaks differently.
